# **Message from the President**

Dear Friends of the HS/HSV Symphony Guild,

These are the words I shared with the attendees at our April 24 Annual Meeting and Youth Orchestra Concert.

First, your Guild is in remarkably strong health considering the two years of disruption caused by the pandemic. We have stayed true to our mission -- the mission of HS/HSV Symphony Guild:

- To present and foster an appreciation for fine music in our community
- To support and promote the Arkansas Symphony Orchestra (ASO)
- To support and encourage music education for young people in the greater Hot Springs area.

We resumed programs this year and are putting together a full schedule for next year.

We did not have to cut back our support for Arkansas Symphony Orchestra and did not consciously curtail any of our educational programs. We presented our annual Children's Concert again this year to over 2,000 children in Hot Springs, and are ramping up our other education programs. For those not familiar with our educational programs, I encourage you to seek out the page on our website that provides detail on those programs – they are the heart of this organization. Included by the way, is sponsoring the Hot Springs area musicians in the youth orchestras you will hear today.

As you might suspect, two years with no concerts to bring in income did have an impact on our budget. If you look at the past 24 months, we show a loss, but it was *not as bad* as I expected. In fact, we have reserves that covered that loss. While income was down, we also had reductions in expenditures. For example, we did not put on a Children's concert last year and some of the educational programs we

offer to schools were constrained by the schools' availability. After all that, the Guild still has a positive balance that includes reserve.

I want to thank all our members who participated in the recent election. This is your organization and your input is important. The results of that election produced (a) slate of officers for 2022-23, taking office on Jun 1. (The list of those elected officers appears later in this newsletter)

Finally, I want to thank our sponsors (please view our sponsors later in this newsletter).

These sponsors make our mission possible. So please thank them.

And when you do business with them, please let them know you appreciate their support.

# ASO Youth Orchestras present Impressive Program

We are always amazed by the talent of Arkansas' student musicians when they grace our Woodlands Auditorium for the Youth Orchestra Concert in association with our annual meeting. The ASO Youth Ensembles have offered unique performance experiences to Arkansas' leading student musicians for more than 50 years. With three ensembles and nearly 200 members, the ensembles included students age 9-19, currently from more than 37 communities around central Arkansas. This year the Academy Orchestra under the direction of Tom McDonald presented Elliott Del Borgo's Wedding Dance and Antonin Dvorak's Symphony No. 9 First Movement. The Youth Orchestra under the direction of Gabriel Bruce presented Dvorak's Slavonic Dances, Peer Gynt's Suite No. 1 Morning Mood in the Hall of the Mountain King, and Tchaikovsky's Swan Lake, Finale to Act 4.
